Dear Parishioners,

As has been announced via other means, this Tuesday, August 15, is the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary, one of the handful of Holy Days of Obligation in our Catholic Church. This is the day we commemorate the fact that Mary, the mother of Jesus, was taken up (assumed) body and soul into Heaven at the conclusion of her earthly life. I'll speak more about this at our Masses which will be Monday evening at 5:30pm and Tuesday at 6am, 8:15am, and 5:30pm. Just a reminder, as on Sundays, all Catholics are obligated to attend Mass on such holy days, hence the title *Holy Day of Obligation!*

Of special note regarding Tuesday's Holy Day, August 15 is the date of the first Mass celebrated at St. Mary's Church in 1887 Also being one of the most significant Marian feast days throughout the year, and our church being named ST. MARY'S, our Liturgy Committee proposed offering a Marian procession on Tuesday.

This is something I was quick to agree to! So essentially what this will be is a brief ceremony following the final 5:30pm Mass on Tuesday. We'll process out of the church with one of our statues of Mary while singing a Marian song. Anyone who would like to participate is welcome to follow along, first we'll go to the image of Our Lady of Perpetual Help on the west side of our school building where we'll recite the Litany of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Then we'll sing Immaculate Mary while following the statue of Mary to one of our shrine areas on the east side of the church. Arriving there, we'll say together the 4th Glorious Mystery of the Rosary, the Assumption. After that we'll proceed back into the church where we'll conclude by reciting the Angelus, another Traditional Marian devotion. We'll also sing a verse or two of a Marian hymn at each station. I anticipate the whole thing taking no more than 20 minutes.

If this strikes your fancy, I look forward to having you join us for this beautiful occasion in honor of the Mother of Jesus and our mother.



"Greybeard: The Man, The Myth, The Mississippi."


