


December 2023 will mark the 118th Anniversary of the release of Sacra Tridentina by Pope Pius X - now Pope St. Pius X. Here is just a short excerpt of a meditation on this document from a book entitled, "Mystery of the Altar: Daily Meditations on the Eucharist". I encourage you to ponder this often this week and ask Our Lord to show you what small step(s) or practices you can start to do to bring you and maybe your family in closer relationship with Our Lord in Holy Communion. God Bless!

"Motivated by his extraordinary piety and love of the faith, Pope St. Pius X
(1835-1914) fearlessly opposed theological modernism and sought to renew all things in Christ. His devotion to the Blessed Sacrament led him to lower the age of First

Communion from twelve to seven and to exhort the laity to frequent, even daily, reception of Communion. Because the clerics and laity alike feared such liberality, the Pope promulgated Sacra Tridentina, settling the requirements for reception of the Eucharist."

The following are the first 2 recommendations found in Sacra Tridentina. (I would encourage you to read the whole document sometime.) 1) Frequent, even daily, Communion is open to all the faithful who are in the state of grace, and who approach the Sacred Table with right intentions. 2) This condition of mind implies that the Blessed Sacrament should be received not from habit, or vanity, or any worldly motives, but from a desire to please God, to be united to Him in the bonds of charity, and to provide against the various trials and tribulations to which flesh is heir.


