ST. MARY'S CHURCH PONTIAC, ILLINOIS

Dear Parishioners.

As Christian believers, we profess Jesus is always with us, and He is with us in no more profound manner than in the Holy Eucharist. As Dt. 4:7 asks rhetorically, "What great nation is there that has a god so near to it as the Lord our God is to us?" The answer professed by all Christian believers of Churches that trace their roots back to the Apostles (both Catholic and Orthodox) is that no nation is closer to God than we



are! We are the closest people to God, particularly when Jesus' Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity is united to our own frail human bodies when we receive the Eucharist in Holy Communion! No other nation has a god so near as the Lord our God is to us!

Despite this, many statistics point toward a decline in Eucharistic belief and devotion, so as I've shared previously, the bishops of the USA have initiated a three year program, called a Eucharistic Revival running through summer 2024, with the goal of inviting people back into a profound, personal relationship with our Eucharistic Lord.

As a part of the Eucharistic Revival, the Diocese of Peoria commissioned a special diocesan monstrance which is traveling throughout our diocese and has been on display at special Holy Hours in every parish in the 26 countries of the diocese. This traveling monstrance, as it's called, began at our Cathedral in Peoria on Monday November 7, 2022 and will conclude at St. Philomena's parish in Peoria on the evening of Thursday June 27, 2024.

This week the Traveling Monstrance is with us at St. Mary's through this coming Tuesday evening, November 7, when we will host a holy hour in the church at 6pm. In the time prior to our Holy Hour on Tuesday, you can see the monstrance in our adoration chapel. You can see the full schedule of the traveling monstrance and other dates of Holy Hours in our area at this link: cdop.org/eucharisticrevival/traveling-monstrance/. I invite you to consider attending the Holy Hour on November 7. The evening will include a brief reflection on the Eucharist, some additional prayers, time for silent prayer in front of the Eucharist and conclude with benediction.

If you've never been to something like this, and especially if you're reading this and thinking "That sounds nice, but I'm not into that sort of thing," or maybe you're thinking, "I don't even know what a Holy Hour or a monstrance are," then I challenge YOU especially: Come to this event. Delve into this Catholic Tradition. Sit before Jesus who is present in the Blessed Sacrament. He'll teach you what you need to know. You may be surprised to hear the Eucharistic Lord speak to you. You just may encounter Him in a new way for the first time in your life.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church describes what we have believed for nearly 2,000 years, "The Eucharist is 'the source and summit' of the Christian life. The other sacraments, and indeed all ecclesiastical ministries and works of the apostolate, are bound up with the Eucharist and are oriented toward it.'

In this Eucharistic Revival and in the traveling monstrance of our diocese, may this essential belief be revived within the souls of many who will allow Jesus to touch their hearts. I hope to see you Tuesday!


