

Dear Parishioners,

This Sunday we return to Ordinary Time and wear green



vestments again until the beginning of Lent on 2/14. While the Christmas Season is now over, prior to the revisions of the Church's calendar in the late 1960s, the Christmas Season continued until February 2, the Feast of the Presentation of Jesus. This is the event, 40 days after Jesus' birth, in which Joseph and Mary, following the Jewish law, presented Him to God in the temple in Jerusalem. Candles were also traditionally blessed in the Church on this day. As such, 2/2 has been known as Candlemas, meaning the bookends of the season in which we celebrate Jesus' birth were previously known by the monikers Christmas and Candlemas. The Feast of Jesus' Presentation and the blessing of candles also has a connection to the phenomenon of Groundhog Day.

With all this in mind, and seeing as how everyone loves Christmas decorations (there's something wrong with you if you don't!!), I would like to keep our Christmas decorations on display at St. Mary's until February 2. I think by that time we'll be ready to move on, but at least for a few more weeks, it will be good to be reminded when we come to the church that Jesus has been born among us, Emmanuel!

I also want to use this opportunity to comment on the recent changes to our distribution of Holy Communion. I spoke about this two Sundays ago, but in case you missed it, we have recently had some mishaps with Holy Communion. Having received feedback from the diocese, I've decided that we will now have 4 communion stations at the front of the church, meaning those in the back of the church will come to the front to receive communion, though we'll still take communion to those at the break with physical limitations. One usher will also be posted on each side of the church during communion simply to observe and ensure everyone places the Eucharist in their mouth after receiving communion. If you happen to notice anyone walking away with the Holy Eucharist, please notify an usher or even approach me or the deacon to let us know.



Thank you to all our priests and Key Parish Leaders from across the Diocese of Peoria for hosting Growing Disciples parish meetings to explain the second set of draft models and how parishioners could provide feedback. Gathering information from those parish meetings is a critical element in the ability to move forward in this important pastoral planning process.

The Growing Disciples Core Team received over 2600 electronic and paper surveys. Bishop Tylka received several hundred personal letters from parishioners and community members, sharing their feelings about the process and what our possibilities could be as we look to the future. The feedback has come from all over the diocese and all parishes. Not everyone in every parish, or even every family, agreed on the steps we should take moving forward.

What is clear is that this process is awakening within all of us that desire for us to continue to be the Church and to grow the Church. We are passionate about our faith. We are passionate about our parishes. We are passionate about our mission that Jesus has given to us to share the Good News.

We also know we are living in very different times. The generations that preceded us had their own challenges and opportunities to live out our faith. Ours is a very different time and we must discern a way forward to build a more sustainable, mission driven, vibrant church for tomorrow.

In the coming months, our Growing Disciples Core Team, our Diocesan Commission and ultimately the Presbyteral Council will be discerning recommendations, based on the feedback, to be given to the Bishop, who will make the final decision.

Let us remain a people of prayer: praying for each other and supporting one another as we go through this process.

Tuition assistance scholarship grants from the endowment fund established as a result of the Diocese of Peoria ROOTED IN FAITH Campaign and named in honor of Archbishop Spalding, the first Bishop of Peoria, will be available for the 2024-2025 school year for students enrolled in or intending to enroll in grades Kindergarten through 12 in any Catholic school located in the Diocese of Peoria whose families are active members of a Catholic parish in the diocese. All grants will be based on financial need objectively assessed. Information about the grants and application materials may be obtained from any Catholic elementary or secondary school in the Diocese of Peoria or on the Diocesan website www.cdop.org under Catholic Education and then under Financial Assistance. Consult the detailed protocols and procedures and checklist for all requirements necessary to be eligible for an award. Parents must apply online at: online.factsmgt.com/aid. Families of students currently receiving grants are reminded that all grants are for one year only, and anyone seeking to renew a grant for the 2024-2025 school year must reapply. Deadline date for the completed application is April 26, 2024. Notification of grant awards will be made in June of 2024.


