
...the story and origin behind "Hail Holy Queen?"

One of the favorite Marian prayers said by Catholics is "Hail Holy Queen." The prayer has an interesting origin.

Hail Holy Queen or Salve Regina is a choral anthem going back to the eleventh century. Since the

thirteenth century it is the last evening chant in many religious communities. The authorship is not clearly defined.

The Salve is first mentioned in a meditation by Anselm II, Bishop of Lucca, 1073-86 (PL 184, 1078-98) and (erroneously) to Hermannus Contractus (1013-54) of Reichenau. the "Hail, Holy Queen" is a salutation deprecatonia, a greeting of petition and intercession. Mary is called mother of mercy because Christ her Son, is



the incarnation of God's love and mercy. Giving us Christ, she gave us, sinful humans, the life and hope we need (as baptized children of Eve) to survive in this vale of tears. This antiphon is not part of the rosary but represents the same spirit. It is part of the official prayer of the Church (Liturgy of the Hours: Vespers and/or Compline) and thus is even more precious than the rosary. Sung, it becomes a wonderful expression of our spiritual intimacy with Mary.



From the Principal's Desk...





appeared!



May is really one of the busiest months of the year. Seriously, it might be busier than even December! We have First Communion, May Procession, Mother's Day, High School and College graduations, followed by SMS graduation coming up later this month on May 25, which leads to the end of school on May 27, and then Memorial Day weekend. That's not counting those who celebrate birthdays, or bridal/baby showers, or weddings, or graduation parties. With all these happenings, it's a wonder we can keep it all straight...and it's an even greater wonder that we find time to focus on the patron of this month – Our Blessed Mother Mary.

For example, I have always felt that there is no more beautiful service we practice in our Catholic faith that can compare with a solemn May procession. Just the music alone – On This Day, O Beautiful Mother, Hail Holy Queen Enthroned Above, Sing of Mary, Regina Caeli (one of my personal favorites from my Morris ICS days), and any one of the several renditions of Ave Maria – is enough to inspire a whole congregation, young and old.

The rain put a damper on part of St. Mary's plans this year, but that didn't detract from the splendor of the ceremony earlier this month. Eighth graders carried a statue of Mary on a litter, followed by a student with the crown that would adorn Our Lady of Fatima up front of the ambo. Mothers (and grandmothers) of students were invited to attend to be recognized and receive a special blessing, and a good number were able to get away from their busy schedule to attend. Both Mary and Moms had to be pleased.

And, hopefully, Mary will also be pleased with another idea that has

surfaced in the past few months. Gardening Angels are entertaining

the thought of converting the west side of the church into a Marian prayer garden. Landscaping ideas are in the works to add some shrubbery and design while moving Mary's statue to a more convenient spot to allow prayer and meditation for those inclined. The site is



much more visible than the prayer garden on the east side of the church, especially to out-of-towners and tourists who use the city parking lot off Main Street. Keep your eyes open for potential opportunities to volunteer on the conversion process.

Here's another little May/Mary idea you might consider. Each day for the rest of this month, I invite you to say one decade of the rosary per day. Just ten Hail Mary's. Ten. You can offer them for any special intention you desire...change it each day, too. Allow our Mother to intercede on our behalf to her Son.

Finally, you can finish the month off by attending our outdoor Mass at St. Mary's Cemetery on Memorial Day, May 30, at 10:30 AM. That will give everyone who's involved with the City ceremony at 9am at Southside Cemetery to attend. We can't think of a better way to end the month than to pray for all those who gave the ultimate sacrifice for our country and our freedom. Our Mother will definitely be watching over us.
